Coronavirus (COVID-19) update - Services have now restarted

Both churches, All Saints, Chilvers Coton and St. Mary the Virgin, Astley, have restarted services. The services at Astley will start at 3.30pm and follow the normal pattern. At Coton we will hold one service each Sunday, starting at 9.30am. This is because we want to encourage both the 08.00 and 10.30 congregations to come. It also means that we do not have to do a 'Covid clean' between the services. The pattern of services will be:

First Sunday - Holy Communion (Common Worship, red book format)

Second Sunday - Holy Communion (Family style service)

Third Sunday - Holy Communion (BCP format)

Fourth Sunday - Morning Celebration (slightly new format)
- Morning Prayer/ Baptism/ or Healing service

We are limited on the number of people who can attend. To meet the Covid regulations, at Coton we will be able to have a maximum of 40 people attending. This number includes the leader and preacher (who will be sitting in the chancel), the warden on duty, and 2 sidespeople. Therefore there will only be space for 35 other people. Each week we will be sending a Survey Monkey invitation to church members inviting them to book a place for the service. If you have not received an invitation please let the Parish Office know. Joanne will phone all those not on e-mail each week to ask if they want to book a place. We request that you arrive early so that you have time to sanitise your hands, give details for NHS track and trace, and then to be shown to your seat. We are not allowed to sing but we can have music videos. **Everyone 11 years old or over must wear a face covering.**

During the Offertory hymn/song there will not be any collections taken. Instead people will be invited to put their offering on the plate at the back as they enter church, or on the plate by the exit door as they leave, or use the card reader at the back of church, or use the Just Giving website. (Have you thought about setting up a Standing Order or Direct Debit payment instead? It would help us to budget and reduce the workload for sidespeople and the treasurer. Please speak to Frank or Gill Charlton for more details).

There is a lot to take in and we will need to be patient and understanding with each other. No doubt we will discover some things that work well and other things that do not. It is all new and we will adapt as we go along. If you have any questions, please let me know. We will continue to publish short reflections of the Bible readings each week. These will be available via the church website, church Facebook pages, or by post to those without a computer or smart phone. If you are reading this and you are aware that we don't have up to date details of how you would like to be kept in touch, then please let Joanne in the Parish Office know how you would like to be contacted.
